Rep. Joe's Straus' Record

Rep. Joe Straus Supported:

- Making it easier to perform late-term, third-trimester abortions (SB 419, vote 672; 2005)
- A public-school sex education bill which was supported by Planned Parenthood, NARAL, and the ACLU. Some described it as allowing "Planned Parenthood to control sex education in Texas." (Rep. Straus co-authored HB 1842; 2007)
- Embryonic stem cell research and human cloning (Rep. Straus coauthored HB 2704; 2007)
- Homosexuals as foster parents (SB 6, vote 327, 2005)
- Expanded gaming and gambling, including casinos (HB 10, vote 939, 2007; and HB 2265, vote 749, 2007)

Rep. Joe Straus Opposed:

- Strengthening marriage and reducing divorce. Rep. Straus voted against encouraging statistically-proven pre-marital education (HB 2685, votes 384, 437, and 1407; 2007)
- Parental rights. Rep. Straus voted against a bill to let parents know the service-referrals that school counselors are making for their children (HB 2136, vote 592, 2007)
- School choice. Rep. Straus voted *for* a budget rider that precluded school choice (HB 1, vote 235, 2007)

Voter ID: A Victim of Speaker Straus' Lack of Leadership

- After becoming Speaker in January of 2009, Rep. Joe Straus Appointed Rep. Todd Smith, a liberal Republican, as chairman of the House Elections Committee.
- Chairman Smith stalled voter identification legislation that was passed by the Senate (SB 362). Chairman Smith later substituted a watered-down bill that would not have secured the right to vote.
- Voter ID legislation, which should have been a clear priority for a Republican Speaker and his chairmen, did not pass.

Liberal Republicans

Of the ten liberal Republicans who joined with Rep. Joe Straus to unseat conservative former Speaker Tom Craddick, two were defeated in their Republican primary by strong conservatives:

- House District 7: Conservative David Simpson defeated Rep. Tommy Merritt
- House District 83: Conservative Charles Perry defeated Rep. Delwin Jones

- For the 2007 legislative session, Rep. Joe Straus was awarded a 100% voting record from the radical pro-abortion group NARAL.
